PRINCIPAL'S REPORT



With the 2020 school year now complete, we can look back with satisfaction and pride in what we as a Vanguard Community have achieved. 2020 has been an amazing year for Vanguard. Through all the strife and turmoil of the Covid-19 pandemic, with its lockdowns and other restrictions, the Vanguard school

community has persevered and remained on track.

As mentioned at the graduation ceremony the amazing results achieved this year would not have been possible without the enormous support from the parents and families of our recruits. The support you gave our recruits during those tough lockdown periods was outstanding, as without the motivation, the continual reassurance and undoubtedly the odd kick in the backside, they would have found self-starting much more difficult. And yes, our recruits have to also be praised for their effort this year, for believing in the school and their parents and families, because without this strong belief in being able to still achieve the goals for the year, we would have faltered.



2020 Academic Results to date:

The 2020 academic results for all recruits who were able to remain at the school, without the addition of the gifted learning recognition credits or the upcoming external exam credits are as follows:

Level One Passed outright 100%

Level Two Passed outright 100%

Level Three Passed outright 100%

Please note: We await the official 2020 NZQA results for the school, as their data will include all recruits who left the school and who possibly did not pass the year at their new school.

Attendance

Recruit attendance for 2020 has dropped off slightly from our expected level for this year, but will still be well above our decile cohort and the national average. The effect of recruits not being able to come to school when even slightly sick (Ministry of Health requirement), has been the reason for this slight drop in overall attendance rates.

2020 Attendance Rate for School 92.0%

The 2020 unjustified absences and intermittent unjustified absences are the lowest we have ever had, at 0.6% and 0.1% respectively.

Congratulations to DP Montgomery and his Hinton Section for setting a new all-time Vanguard record, by winning the inter-section competition for the fourth time. Hinton recruits have won the ISC four times out of seven, with DP Montgomery winning four out of six with two second places, since joining the school. Well done to all the recruits that have ever been in Hinton section. As it stands, it will take at least another four years before another section could theoretically take this record away from Hinton.

ABSENCES



STUDENT FEEDBACK

One of our students was lucky enough to experience The Spirit of New Zealand in 2020 after the second Lockdown. Here she tells us what her experience was like:

The 15th of September is a day I'll never forget.

I woke up at 6.30, to get to Princes wharf where I would board The Spirit of New Zealand a trainee. I had no idea what to expect from this journey except for an ocean swim at 6.00 am every morning. At 11 I said goodbye to my mum and carried my bags onto what was going to be my home for the next 10 days, I was really nervous and didn't know how I would survive without my phone, family and friends but a part inside of me told me that I needed to see this adventure through. After my little moment of doubt, I am shown to the girls cabin which consisted of a room of 20 stretcher beds and one draw for all of our stuff. Before I can even complain, about three girls ask if I needed help, the immediate kindness I was shown reassured me that this voyage would be a good experience, and it was.

Over the next ten days I grew in ways I didn't know I could, I mentally grew in areas I didn't know I needed to. I could use my voice when I had to lead, and make the words I spoke meaningful, I got back some of my social skills I had lost during quarantine. All of us on the voyage were so different and we all came from different backgrounds and having so many different people around me made me realise that the world is so much bigger than I thought. Hearing everyone's stories about where they came from reminded me how important it is to acknowledge people's backgrounds and cultures and to never assume that their life is the same as yours because I didn't meet a single person on the voyage whose life was even a bit similar to mine.

One stand out highlight of the whole adventure was when me and my friend got picked to cook for the whole crew and all the trainees. Although cooking for 50 people was one of the most stressful things I've experienced, it made me realise that no matter how bad things go, a good meal fixes everything, a good lesson to learn for someone who loves to cook.

Throughout the voyage, we all grew as individuals and as a team and sometimes the really quiet person would be the leader for the day and that's when I realised that you don't have to be the biggest, loudest or most good-looking person to be a leader, you just have to want what's best for your team and thoroughly communicate how you think you can achieve your team's betterment.

The Spirit of New Zealand was something I'll always remember, it truly was an adventure, and even though it was difficult at the time and I wanted to rest, I would do it all again a million times if I could.

A quote I heard from one of the crew resonates with me to this day, it goes like this, "It is when you are safe at home, you wish you were on an adventure and when you are on an adventure, you wish you were safe at home." Even though my calluses have calluses from hauling ropes and steering sails and I was seasick, I saw sunsets and views I thought only existed in movies, I stargazed, I

laughed, I cried, I climbed the mast, I jumped off the ship and swam in ice cold water, I remembered what it was like to live without technology and best of all, I met amazing people I'll never forget. I loved every bit of it. Thank you, Vanguard and The Spirit of New Zealand, for this experience and learning opportunity.
